The annual gender sensitization plan is as follows several activities like debates, quizzes and educative programs are organized to sensitize the Gender equality and gender equity among staff and students.

International Womens Day is conducted annually (in the month of March) during which the eminent people are invited to give talk on Gender equity and women safety. On the same occasion the eminent personalities are honoured. During orientation programme for new students, familiarize them with campus life and values.

Coordinate with state and National commission for women to raise awareness levels regarding womens rights and prevention of sexual harassment through workshops and seminars.

Bathukamma (Floral) Festival

The Bathukamma festival is a vibrant and culturally significant celebration celebrated by the women of telangana state. This festival which typically occurs in September or October coincides with the navratri festival and is dedicated to the worship of goddess gouri an incarnation of goddess Durga. Bathukamma which translates to “Mother goddess come alive,” symbolizes the reverence of women and the celebration of natures bounty, particularly the blooming of flowers.

The institute organizes Bathukamma festival one day with in the campus every year at the end of September or starting of October and encourages all the female staff and students to actively participate in the event.

NCC and NSS Programs:

We encourage girls students to join **NCC** and **NSS** and ensure equal rights and participations in regular cultural activities. It elevates the caliber of the Girl students and inculcate confidence among them.

Safety and security

- We are committed to gender equity and increasing the representation of women in senior roles.
- The institute considers the safety of female students and staff as their utmost priority. To ensure their safety, security cameras have been installed at important places on the campus.

Safety in Transport:

- The transport facility for the students are also made hassle free by the installation of **Oredo GPS tracking** system to all the college buses. The reservation for the girls students in college buses are also strictly supported.
- To ensure hassle-free and safe journeys, the transport department has allotted the front seats reserved for the female faculty and students.

Special Provisions for female students

- To ensure the proper safety of the female students in the classrooms, each section was allocated two class representatives from girls.
- A women's protection cell was constituted to monitor the disciplinary activities on the campus relating to females.
- To encourage female students in extracurricular activities viz, Sports, NSS, the institute encourages equal participation from both Girls and Boys.

Counseling

- A women's grievance cell was constituted to address the issues and provide counseling for all the female students. The institute offers orientation programs and counseling sessions at the beginning of each academic year.

Common rooms

- Considering the girl's health, hygiene, and comfort, The institute has set up several girls' common rooms with basic facilities for refreshment and relaxation.

Gender sensitization lab in Academic Curriculum

- Course name called MC 400: GENDER SENSITIZATION LAB was included in the academic curriculum of the university, It is an interdisciplinary field that teaches critical points about gender and sex in the society. The main objectives of the course includes
 - a. To improve students sensibility with respects to issues of gender in society.
 - b. To present a significant perspective on the socialization of men and women
 - c. To encourage students to healthy communication between men and women.

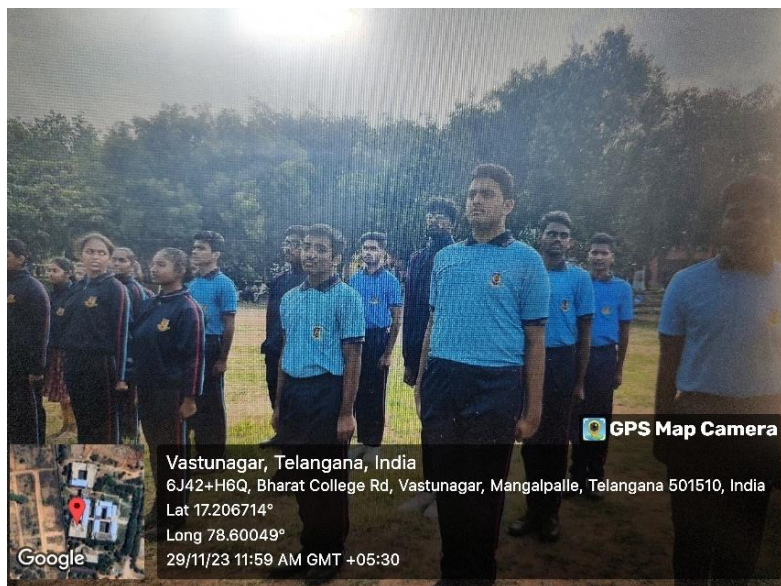

Refer to the activities that men and women actually do; can be changed at a time, conditions and situations.

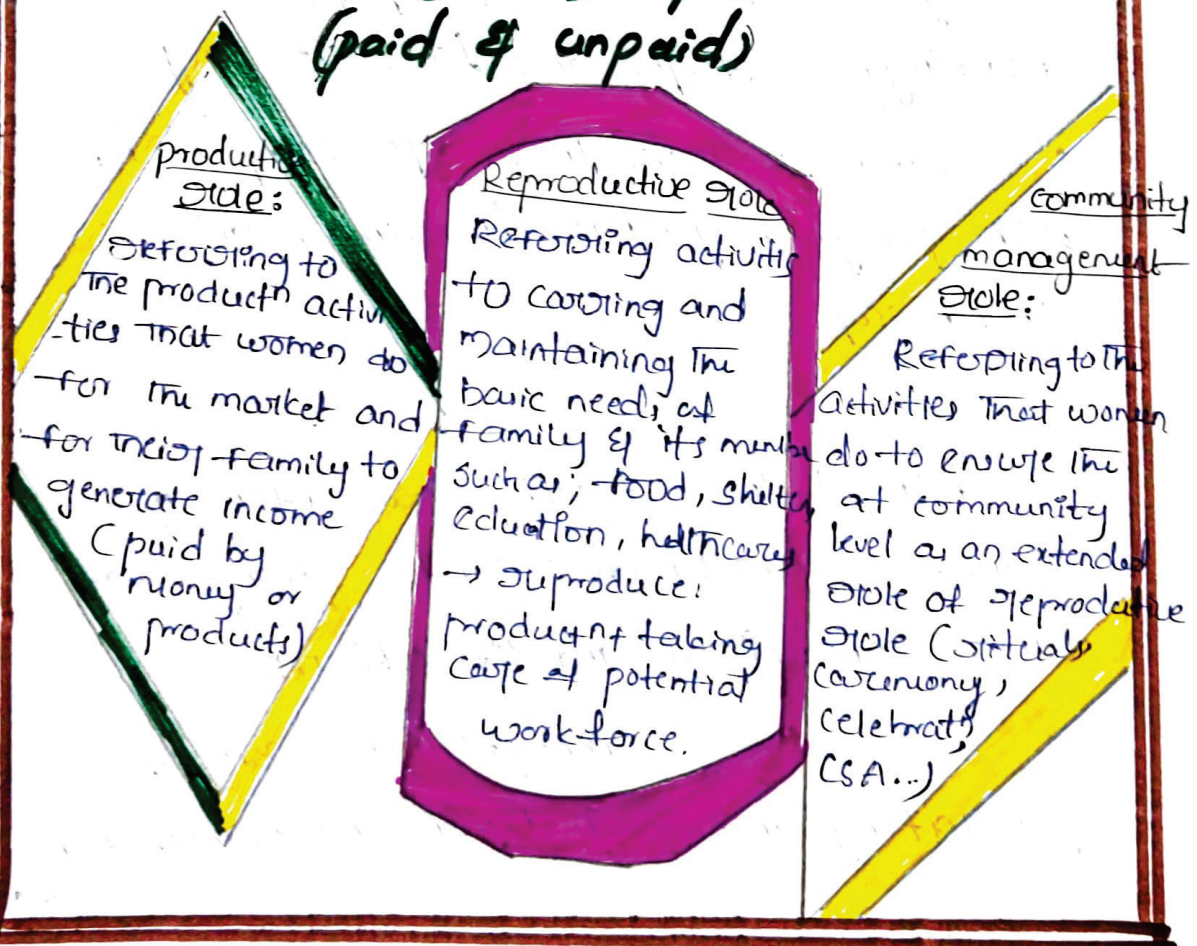
- Productive roles refers to the work of generating income that men and women do,

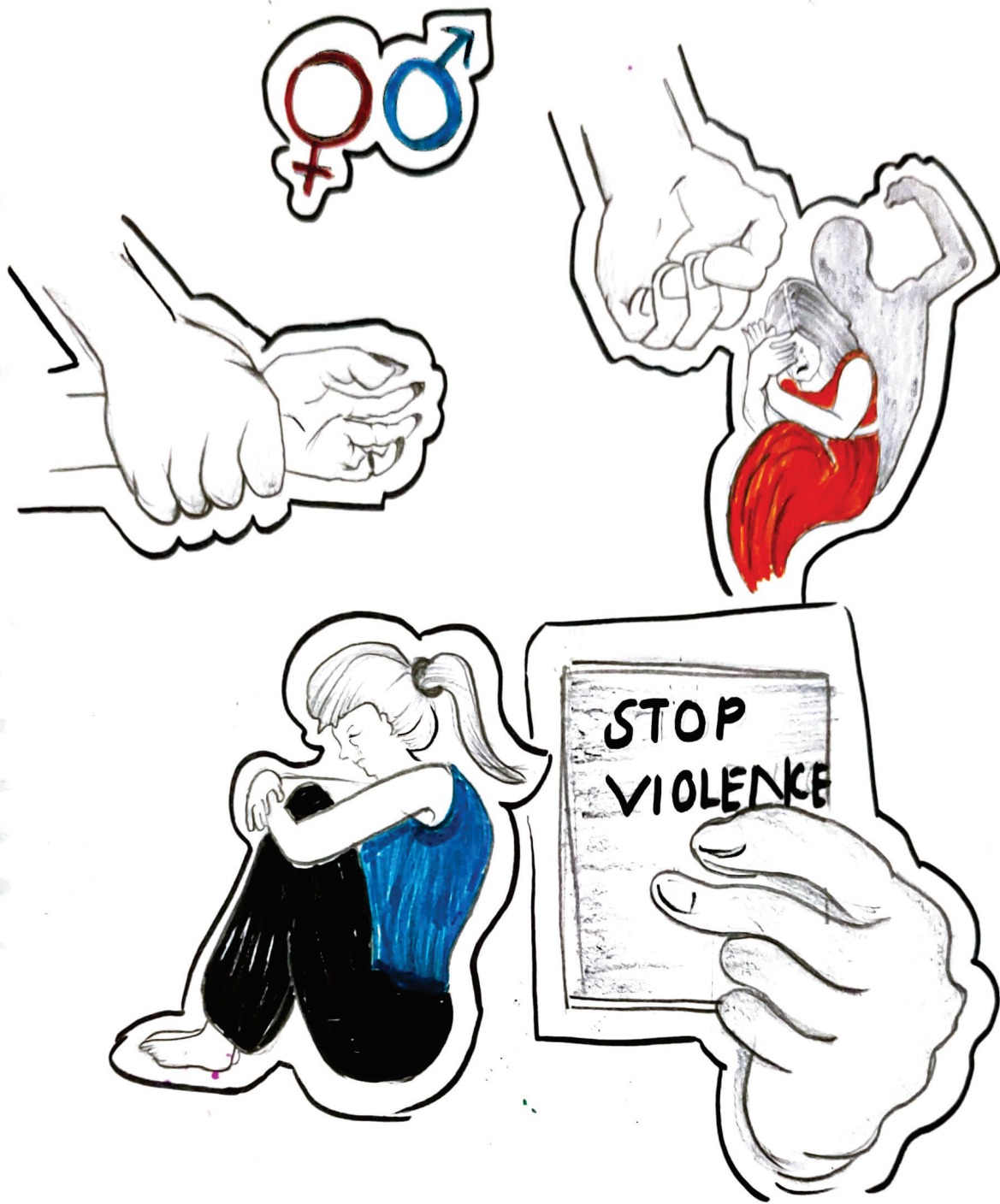

Forms of Domestic Violence:—

• **Physical abuse:** means any act (or) conduct which is of such a nature as to cause bodily pain, harm, (or) danger to life, limb, (or) health or impair the health or development of the aggrieved person and includes assault, criminal intimidation and criminal force.

• **Sexual abuse** includes any conduct of a sexual nature that abuses, humiliates, degrades (or) otherwise violates the dignity of women.

• **Verbal And Emotional abuse** includes:—

• —insults, ridicule, humiliation, name calling and insults (or) specificity with regard to not having a child (or) a male child; and.

• Repeated threats to cause physical pain to any person in whom the aggrieved person is interested.

Domestic violence:-

The Domestic abuse, also called "domestic violence" or "intimate partner violence"; can be defined as a pattern of behavior in any relationship that is used to gain or maintain power and control over an intimate partner. Abuse is physical, sexual, emotional, economic or psychological actions or threats of actions that influence another person. This includes any behaviors that frighten, intimidate, terrorize, manipulate, hurt, humiliate, balance, injure, or wound someone. Domestic abuse can happen to anyone of any race, age, sexual orientation, religion, or gender. It can occur within a range of relationships including couples who are married, living together or couples who. Domestic violence affects people of all socioeconomic backgrounds and education levels.

— Anyone can be a victim of domestic violence, regardless of age, race, gender, sexual orientation, faith or class.



Verbal violence and hate speech

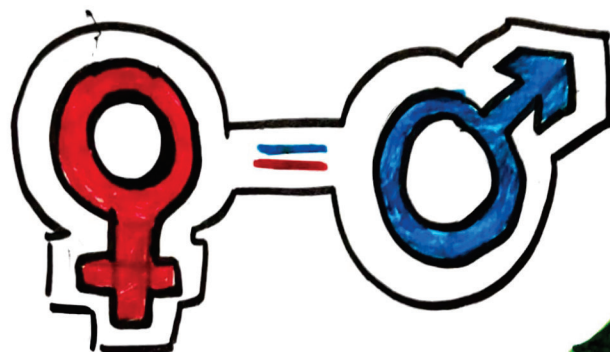
Many cultures have sayings (or) expressions to the effect that words are harmless, and there is a long tradition that teaches us to ignore verbal attacks. The object of the attacks is right to consider themselves victims of verbal abuse. It includes issues that are specific to person, such as putdowns, ridiculing, the use of swear-words that are especially uncomfortable for the other forms of violence, either against the victim (or) against somebody dear to them. At other times, the verbal abuse may be relevant to the background of the victim, such as their religion, culture, language; (perceived) sexual orientation (or) traditions.

Depending on the most emotionally sensitive areas of the victim, abusers often consciously target these issues in a way that is painful, humiliating and threatening to the victim.

violence and can even be the reason why other forms of violence are inflicted. Global economic data clearly show that one of the consequences of globalization is the feminisation of poverty. However economic vulnerability is a phenomenon that also exists on the personal level. It has been recognised in a vast number of abusive relationships as a distinct phenomenon, which is why it deserves a category of its own. However, even when the relationship is reversed, and a woman has a higher economic status in a relationship, this does not necessarily eliminate the threat of violence: conflicts about status and emasculation may arise, particularly in already abusive relationships. Some public forms of socio-economic gender-based violence contribute to women becoming economically dependent on their partners.



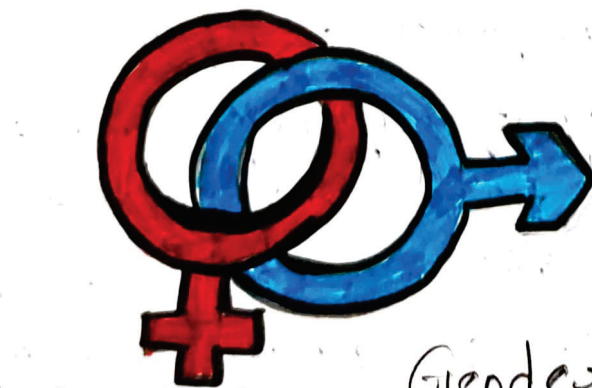

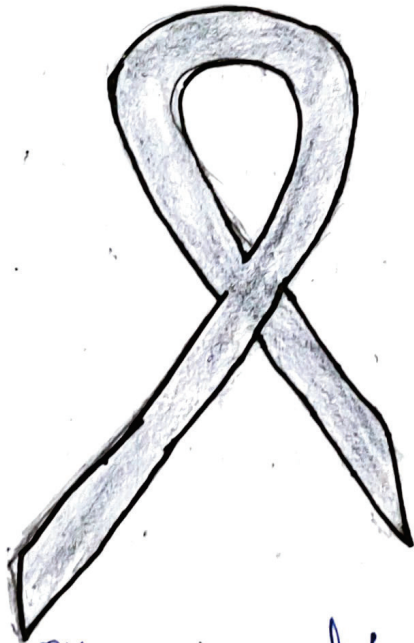
Domestic violence is violence or other abuse that occurs in domestic setting, such as in a marriage or cohabitation. Domestic violence is often used as a synonym for intimate partner violence, which is committed by one of the people in an intimate relationship against the other person, it can take place in relationships or between former spouses or partners. In its broadest sense, domestic violence also involves violence against children, parents, or the elderly.

It can assume multiple forms, including physical, verbal, emotional, economic, religious, reproductive, or sexual abuse. It can range from subtle, sensitive forms to marital rape and other violent physical abuse, such as choking, beating, female genital mutilation, and acid throwing that may result in disfigurement or death, and include.

the use of technology to harass, control, monitor, stalk or hurt, domestic murder includes stoning, bride burning, honor killing, and dowry death, which sometimes involves non-cohabitating family members. in 2015, the united kingdom's home office widened the definition of domestic violence to include coercive control.

It may produce an intergenerational cycle of violence in children and other family members, who may feel that such violence is acceptable or condoned. Many people do not recognize themselves as abusers or victims, because they may consider their experiences as family conflicts.
