PROTOCOL

ABSTRACT:

Introduction: Gout is an inflammatory joint disease, associated with an elevated uric acid level in blood which further leads to the deposition of urate crystals in the joints and kidneys followed by sudden, severe episodes of pain, tenderness, redness, warmth and swelling. Silver nanoparticles will be synthesized using 1mM aqueous silver nitrate solution from the extracts of *Tinospora cordifolia* and formation of silver nanoparticles will be confirmed by UV-Visible spectroscopy, FTIR, X-RD, Zeta potential and scanning electron microscopy. *Tinospora cordifolia* is selected based on its anti-inflammatory activity and phytochemical analysis will be carried.

Objective: To evaluate anti-inflammatory activity of *Tinospora cordifolia* (Guduchi Ghana) extract loaded silver nanoparticles for treating Gouty Arthritis.

Methods: Soxhlet extraction method and green synthesis will be employed to plant extract loaded with silver nanoparticles. The resultant nanoparticles will be subjected to characterization using UV-Visible spectroscopy, FTIR, X-RD, Zeta potential and scanning electron microscopy (SEM). Herbal gel formulation will be designed to evaluate toxicity and anti-inflammatory activity.

Anticipated result: Tinospora cordifolia extract loaded with silver nanoparticles formulation is expected to show effectiveness in treating inflammation associated with Gouty Arthritis. Secondary plant metabolites may response for their action.

INTRODUCTION:

Gout is an inflammatory joint disease, associated with an elevated uric acid level in blood which further leads to the deposition of urate crystals in the joints and kidneys followed by painful inflammation, gouty arthritis, and uric acid nephrolithiasis. Xanthine oxidase (XO) is responsible for oxidation of hypoxanthine to xanthine and finally xanthine to uric acid. Over activity of this enzyme and increased intake of dietary food rich in nucleic acids (e.g. meat, leguminous seeds) impair renal excretion of uric acid and result in hyperuricemia and gout [1].

Inflammation is the complex response of the immune system to infection and injury that leads to removal of offending factors and restoration of tissue structure and physiological function [12]. The symptoms of inflammation are characterized by pain, heat, redness, swelling and loss of function. It can be classified into two major types either acute or chronic, based on the duration of the inflammatory reaction. Though initiated as a protective phenomenon, loss of regulation of this complex process can lead to the development of various inflammatory disorders[2].

Another alternative method to develop newer anti-inflammatory agents with sustained release and better efficacy is the use of nanotechnology for drug development and delivery. Nanotechnology deals with the synthesis and fabrication of materials at the nanoscale level (1-100 nm). Among the various nanoparticles available, silver nanoparticles are gaining more importance due to their diversified biological properties and potential applications. Silver has been used since ancient times for the treatment of wounds and inflammation and nanoparticles of silver have been developed which have potent anti- inflammatory and anti-oxidant activities[2].

Silver nanoparticles can be synthesized by various physical and chemical methods, however they are costly, cumbersome and toxic to the environment. The use of biological systems as potential nanofactories has been widely explored as they are economical and eco-friendly. Plant extracts contain phyto-chemicals which aid in the reduction of the silver ions. The added advantage of using plants is that the alkaloids or also act as capping agents, thereby conferring the silver nanoparticles with additional pharmacological properties[2].

Inospora cordifolia (commonly referred as Amrita or Guduchi) is a large, glabrous, climbing thrub indigenous to tropical Indian subcontinent and other Asian countries belonging to the amily Menispermaceae. A variety of constituents have been isolated from Tinospora ordifolia from different parts such as alkaloids, diterpenoid lactones, steroids, glycosides, liphatic compounds and polysaccharides. It is widely used especially for nmune-modulatory, cardio-protective and hepato-protective. In Ayurveda, it has shown Antineumatic, anti-gout activity, it has also shown beneficial effect in diabetic foot ulcers and lergic rhinitis[3].

NEED OF THE STUDY:

The drugs used in inflammatory disorders may be either insignificant anti-inflammatory effects or mild to moderate anti-inflammatory activity. These drugs can cause gastric or intestinal ulceration that can sometimes cause secondary anemia including the liver damage to ultimate failure.

The present study is undertaken to synthesize silver particles using the aqueous extract of *Tinospora cordifolia* and to evaluate the silver nanoparticles for anti-inflammatory activity. Thus by synthesizing silver nanoparticles using *Tinospora cordifolia* extract, the potential advantages of phytomedicine and nanomedicine will be combined to result in a more enhanced and synergistic anti-inflammatory effect.

PATIENTS AND METHODS: -

AIM AND OBJECTIVE

AIM: - The aim of the study is Evaluation of Anti-Inflammatory Activity of *Tinospora* cordifolia (Guduchi Ghana) extract loaded Silver Nanoparticles for treating Gouty Arthritis.

OBJECTIVE: -

- 1. Collection and authentication of plant by botanist.
- 2. To prepare plant extract and silver Nanoparticles loaded with plant extract
- Characterization of silver Nanoparticles loaded with plant extract using UV-Visible spectroscopy, FTIR, X-RD, Zeta potential and scanning electron microscopy(SEM).
- 4. To prepare herbal gel formulation.
- 5. To conduct skin irritation test
- To evaluate the efficacy of herbal gel formulation for anti-inflammatory action among the study population.

STUDY DESIGN

• A prospective open – label, non – randomized, outpatient-based, single centered study that will be carried out to determine the efficacy of drug for anti-inflammatory action among the study population.

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- Patients with C/O inflammation both Male and Female aged about (Male 30-50yr) and (Female pre and post menopause) will be selected in our studies and with their consent will be performed for 1 month using test (GEL) drug.
- The test ayurvedic GEL will be applied on their different joints (preferred) or region
 where inflammation is occurring and with necessary precautions.
- The data is will be collected from the different groups of patients after therapy.
- The result will be calculated by using statistical tools.

STUDY SITE: - Bharat Institute of Technology and Dr. B.R.K.R. government Ayurvedic hospital, Erragadda, Hyderabad, (T.S)

STUDY PERIOD: - The study was proposed to be conducted for the period of 6 months.

Preparation of Extract:

The stems of *Tinospora cordifolia* will be dried in hot air oven at 55°C for 20 min. The stems will be grinded mechanically to make powder.

Preparation of hydro -alcoholic extract:

Powder (100g) will be defatted with petroleum ether and extracted with ethanol(95% v/v) with distilled water (80:20) using Soxhlet extraction apparatus. The filtrate obtain will be subjected to dryness at 100°C on water bath to give a residue.(4)

Synthesis of silver nanoparticles:

To 100 ml of 1mM AgNO3 solution, 1 mbof the aqueous extract *Tinospora cordifolia* will be added and the mixture will be kept in a magnetic stirrer for 2 hrs. The mixture will be then centrifuged at 3000 rpm for 10 min and the residue will be used for characterization studies

Preparation of Topical Gel: 200 ml - 1970

Herbal gel will be prepared using carbopol-934 as a gelling agent in 1% w/w concentration with deionized water using mechanical stirrer. With continuous stirring, other ingredients like glycerine will be added. 1 % w/w herbal extract will be added to the gel and stirr for sufficient time homogeneous mixing of extracts in gel base. Further, the topical formulation will be evaluated with physicochemical evaluation(pH, viscosity, spreadability etc.,). Prepare gel will be filled in collapsible tubes and stored at cool and dry place.(6)

Toxicity Studies:

Skin irritation test will be done on rabbits based on standard statistical tools.

Protocol

INTRODUCTION:

In Ayurvedic approach, falling of hair is coined out as in term of 'Khalitya', "Medhya" is an Ayurvedic concept that implies intellect or wisdom. The word "Memory" refers to the faculty by which the mind stores and remembers information. It is the power or process of reproducing or recalling what has been learned and retained especially through associative mechanisms. Mild forgetfulness and short term memory loss are common complaints in people as they age.

Hair nourishment and grooming aids have become increasingly popular throughout the world. Preparations available in the market for men include hair creams, liquid brilliantines, pomades and solid brilliantines, tonics, lotions and conditioners and for women wave sets, hair sprays, special rinsesand lotions, brilliantines and conditioners. There are number of herbal plants, utilized in hair care formulations.

Nootropics are class of cognitive enhancing supplement that improve concentration and boost memory. Nootropics are often used to increase attention spans, help individuals focus and as studying aids. Nootropics referred to as "smart drugs "as they are associated with increased intelligence, motivation, and mental energy.

The objective of the study is to formulate hair nourishment oil applied topically which imparts hair growth, nourishment as well as improve memory and concentration by the incorporation of herbal drugs.



Patients with AGA were randomly assigned to rosemary oil (n = 50) or minoxidil 2% (n = 50) for a period of 6 months. In contrast, both groups experienced a significant increase in hair count at the 6-month endpoint compared with the baseline and 3-month endpoint (P < .05).^[9]

NEED FOR STUDY:

The word "Nootropic" comes from the Greek for "to bend or shape the mind." The formulated hair oil is used to enhance memory, concentration and as well as for the hair growth. The effect of the formulated hair oil is good on the hair and memory.

The formulation has a beneficial effect on the human volunteers. It is also used as a preventive theory for Alzheimer's disease and Dementia.

PATIENTS AND METHODS: AIM: - To perform "A Prospective Clinical Study to Evaluate the Efficacy of Nootropic Hair

PREPARATION OF HERBAL HAIR OIL:

- a) Initially the drugs which are to be powdered are dried in the shade so that there will be no loss of the active metabolites for 48 hours.
- b) Then the drugs are powdered and passed through sieve number 100 to make it a fine powder of the drugs.
- c) The oil of all the other drugs is mixed together to form oil base.
- d) The powdered drugs are then added to the oily base to form a uniform mixture and heated on a water bath.
- e) Now allow the mixture to settle for 2 days and then again heat it on water bath.
- Sonication process is carried out after heating.
- g) Centrifugation is performed after this and the supernatant oil is collected after centrifugation.
- h) Transfer the formulated oil into a suitable container.

TOXICITY STUDIES:

The prepared formulation is assessed for primary skin irritation test. Six healthy rats were selected for the study. Each rat was caged individually food and water given during the test period 24 hrs prior to the test. The hair from the back of each rat of 1cm2 was shaved on the side accommodate three test sites of the spine to expose sufficiently large test areas,

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were cleaned with surgical sprit. Measured quantity (1ml) (5% w/w) of the formulations OD1, OD2 and OD3 were applied over the respective test sites on one side of the spine and observed for erythema and edema for 48hrs after application.

INCLUSION CRITERIA:

- Study subjects should be > 18 years.
- Healthy human volunteers either male or female.
- Subjects who are willing to participate and signing informed consent form.
- Subjects who are not on any other memory enhancement therapy.
- Subjects who are ready to not to take any other medication during the course of the study unless there is serious illness or in case of emergency.

EXCLUSION CRITERIA:

- Subjects below 18 years of age.
- Unhealthy human volunteers.
- Patients suffering from psychological problems.
- Subjects who are not willing to participate and not signing informed consent form.
- Pregnant women and lactating mother.
- Subjects who for at least 1 week prior to study have used any drugs, alcohol or indulge in smoking.
